


Photo 72 shows a view of Dam 3 with Boomerang Lake on the left.



Photo 79 shows a small ditch which runs from the south end towards the north and then bends 90 degrees to the east across the crest of this dam. It is used to direct some of the surficial drainage and from this perspective, looks in satisfactory condition.




where it meets Boomerang Lake. This is the area where historically significant sloughs are noted right


