On behalf of the Nunavut Tunngavik Incorporated (NTI), I have reviewed the aforementioned application. The following advice has been provided pursuant to Land & Resources mandated responsibilities.

The department requests that the monitoring of wildlife harvested, namely caribou, within the area be done each month once the all weather road is completed. In the letter dated the 24th of April, 2006 there is a section where harvest numbers in a 5 year period for caribou, wolverine and grizzly bear was indicated. A monitoring period of 5 years after the road opens will give an indication of any significant changes in harvest numbers. Include all small mammal mortality such as foxes, hikhiks, etc. being accidentally run over.

The Department of Land & Resources requests notification of any changes in the proposed project, as further review may be necessary. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any further questions or comments with regards to the foregoing by telephone or by email.
