Q = How come Maps are not in Inuktitut?

A = we will look into getting them done in Inuktitut



- Q = Wondering if information news letter sent out 2 times a month is enough or should it be more often??
- A = this question will be transferred to the HR department for AEM.
- Q = How come the vest need to be worn on the road?
- A = Vests need to be worn to increase the individuals visibility for traffic on the road.
- Q = Do we have to wear the vest all the time? Bright colors can scare away animals when we are trying to hunt them.
- A = Vest only need to be worn while you are on the road. Once off the road the vests can be taken off.

Additional Items relayed as per Stephane Larose – AWPAR ROAD/BAKER LAKE SUPERVISOR

- Please be sure to make yourself visible to heavy equipment before passing, for example a grader.
- Please wait for the grader operator to give you a signal to pass prior to going around the grader
- Pass on the left side unless the operator directs you to the other side
- When going over Blind Hills be sure to travel on the right hand side of the road, not in the center. If another vehicle is coming the other way it could result in a collision.
 - Q = Sometimes when we go to go over the blind hills the big trucks make too much dust, so it is hard to drive on the right side.
 - A = If a truck is going by, making lots of dust, you should pull your ATV to the side of the road for the truck to go past, and then wait for the dust to settle before going again. If you do not wait for the dust to settle, another truck could be coming that you don't see and an accident can happen.
 - Q = Do the lights need to stay on, on the Honda's?
 - A = Yes while on the road the lights should remain on.
 - Q = How come the emergency shelters were removed from the road?
 - A = Cost to up keep was very high. Instead of having these, the road supervisors and Security personnel are a lot stricter on closing the road. If there is bad weather forecasted, it is more likely the road will be closed to not allow travelers into dangerous situations.
 - Q = Will the shelters be reinstalled during winter?



A =No they will not be reinstalled. Most of the old shelters are being used on other portions of the project.

Only ATVs are allowed to travel on the road.

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If the Gatehouse is closed, the road is also closed, and access is not allowed. This is likely due to unsafe weather, road conditions or safety reasons.

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- •AEM reserves the right to refuse entry to anyone who does not respect these safety rules and procedures.
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- •AEM reserves the right to restrict public access in periods of heavy mine traffic flow, for example, during the transfer of supplies from Baker Lake to Meadowbank after the annual sealift. This will only be done in consultation with the HTO and Baker Lake Hamlet (Mayor).

- •ATV operators must also wear a safety vest while travelling on the road.

■AEM traffic has the right of way – the ATV must pull off the road when a vehicle is oncoming or approaching from behind and wait for that vehicle to pass before entering back onto the road.

Maximum speed is50 km/hr.


