Hi Richard.


I am right now on duty-travel and wasn't able yet to check the KivIA comments regarding the completeness check. If KivIA requires additional information to be included within the application we should forward the comments to AEM to address your information request. And once requested information received the Board will issue a Notice of application with inviting parties for full 30 days technical review. The notice will include also approximate dates for in-person technical meeting and pre-hearing conference to occur probably in Rankin Inlet (subject to the Board decision) approximately 3 weeks after the deadline for technical comments submissions.

If your comments could be addressed at the full technical review stage the Board could invite parties for a full technical review a little bit earlier.

For your information AEM already got AANDC completeness review comments a week ago, and according to AEM they needed around 10 days to respond. I believe we will have them very soon.

I am also cc-ing our Licensing department. For time saving purposes you could let Phyllis know whether or not KivIA require addition information from AEM at this stage, and she will be able to submit your comments/request to AEM to be addressed asap.
