To facilitate infrastructure construction and surface contact water management, Agnico Eagle dewatered pond H17 as per the Water Management Plan (June 2015) and water licence 2AM-MEL1631. Water in pond H17 was pumped to a physical filtration device (geotubes) to then be discharged into Meliadine Lake based on License A and MMER discharge permissible limits. The treatment unit was in operation from September 17 to October 3, 2016.

In accordance with Water License 2AM-MEL1631, Part D, Item 3 and Schedule D, and Project Certificate 11MN034 Condition 18, please find enclosed with this letter, a copy of the Construction Summary Report for the Chemical Treatment Unit.
