# **Preamble**

On May 4, 2018, the Qikiqtani Inuit Association (QIA) requested ARKTIS Solutions Incorporated (ARKTIS) to evaluate changes to QIA's security estimate based on Baffinland Iron Mines Corporation's (Baffinland) May 4, 2018¹ and May 8, 2018² marginal security revisions. ARKTIS' recommended updated reclamation security adjustment pursuant to the Commercial Lease No. Q13C301³ (Lease), for liability on Inuit Owned Lands (IOL) resulting from a review of Baffinland's May 2018 Revised Marginal Increase Revision 1², is a marginal increase in security of \$10.3M or \$76.2M global security estimate. If inflation is to be used as previously described in the 2018 Mary River Reclamation Security Report⁴, this means a marginal increase in security of \$11.6M or \$77.5M global security estimate.

Baffinland, however, has proposed an adjustment of **\$9.6M** or **\$71.2M**, a proposed decrease of \$12,491,500 from the Nunavut Water Board's (NWB) approved<sup>5</sup> marginal increase of \$22,067,500 or a global security amount of \$83,709,271.

ARKTIS' updated costs are illustrated in **Table 1**, and are based on ARKTIS' review of Baffinland's submission<sup>2</sup>. Please note that this is a summary of the changes proposed, only, and has been expedited to provide QIA with a security adjustment value to facilitate Baffinland remaining compliant with QIA's notice of default submitted April 26, 2018<sup>6</sup>. The recommended approach, as shown in the **May 2018 ARKTIS column**, is to not change the Direct Costs proposed by Baffinland. The changes in Direct Costs proposed by Baffinland are minimal and evidence provided is inadequate to support their removal. Therefore, all changes presented in **Table 1** are based on changes to QIA Indirect Costs for 3<sup>rd</sup> Party Equipment and Expansion Project Equipment and Materials only.

Expansion Project Equipment and Materials continues to be calculated on a \$2M cost for a 27,000 m³ capacity ship³. ARKTIS has continued to use the methodology that a whole ship would be required for any mobilization of Expansion Project Equipment and Materials in lieu of a \$/m³ approach adopted by Baffinland. ARKTIS believes the whole ship method for the Expansion Project Equipment and Material is the most realistic approach given the size of the equipment.
