RE: Type 'A' Water Licence 2AM-MRY1325 - ICRP Version 6 and WRF Thermal Model

Dear Mr. Hunter,

The Qikiqtani Inuit Association (QIA) wishes to inform the Nunavut Water Board (NWB) that it does not support the approval of Baffinland Iron Mines Corporation's (Baffinland) Interim Closure and Reclamation Plan (ICRP) Version 6 and the Waste Rock Facility (WRF) Thermal Model, distributed by the NWB on January 28, 2025, in accordance with Part D, Item 2 of the Type 'A' Water Licence 2AM-MRY-1325 (the Licence).

QIA was recently notified by Baffinland that it will no longer support or fund the Inuit Stewardship Program (ISP) and the Inuit Avatimut Kamattianirmut Katimajiit (IAKK). The ISP and IAKK are central to Inuit engagement and are critical to the implementation of ICRP Version 6, which was developed collaboratively by BIMC and QIA. The ISP and IAKK were intended to play a key role in defining Inuitinformed closure and revegetation objectives, water and air quality criteria at closure, as well as postclosure monitoring and long-term site care.

Given BIMC's decision to deny funding for the ISP/IAKK, it is no longer able to fulfill the commitments outlined in ICRP Version 6 as submitted to the NWB. In this context, QIA does not support ICRP Version 6. Without these key components in place, namely the ISP and IAKK, QIA does not have confidence that the goals on community engagement can be achieved.
