The invasive plant monitoring component outlines the means by which Agnico Eagle plans to reduce Project-related effects to plant populations and communities, primarily through the mitigation and management of invasive species. Invasive plant inspection surveys will be completed on cargo in Becancour, prior to being loaded onto shipping vessel(s).

Inspection

- Inspection of all equipment and supplies brought to the project sites are clean and free of soils that could contain plant seeds or organic matter not naturally occurring in the area.
- Vehicle tires and treads are inspected prior to initial use in project areas

Specific Cleaning Measures

- Equipment and bulk supplies will be cleaned using brooms, brushes, shovels, water, or compressed air. Areas of particular concern include tires, tracks, skids, buckets, scoops, and packing materials.
- Accumulated soil, plant material or crop debris from openings, tracks, skids, wheels, buckets, scoops, and packing materials using a hand scraper, shovel, broom, or other methods.
- Additional focus should be made to areas where soil or plant debris can accumulate (i.e., tires or undercarriage).

Documentation

- All c-cans and heavy equipment brought to the project site must be inspected and documented
