Environment and Climate Change Canada (ECCC) has reviewed the information submitted to the Nunavut Water Board (NWB) regarding the responses to ECCC's comments on above-mentioned monitoring and management plans and is submitting comments via email. 1. Re: Water Management During Closure (ECCC#1)

Comment

The Proponent has stated in their response that they will monitor untreated contact water during the Closure phase to provide confidence in the consistency of discharge and seepage quality as per the Water Licence monitoring requirements. These monitoring requirements will be established prior to the Closure phase in collaboration with ECCC and the NWB (Page 6).



ECCC accepts this commitment by the Proponent to monitor seepage/contact water in accordance with Water Licence conditions regarding monitoring and water quality objectives, and notes that there will need to be a sufficient period of post-treatment monitoring to demonstrate consistent acceptability for discharge to receiving waters.
