The Government of Nunavut (CLEY) has reviewed the material for the modification of Hope Bay Mining's sewage disposal facility for the Boston advanced exploration site, and enabled generally by the July 6, 2007 Nunavut Water Board licence. The activity appears to be replacing and upgrading current sewage works.

The department does not object to the application. The proponent must appreciate that it is their responsibility to ensure that no heritage resources are directly or indirectly altered from their current state in the course of, or the result of, their activities.

All archaeological and palaeontological sites in Nunavut are protected by law. Should any site be encountered, the proponent must contact the Department of Culture, Language, Elders and Youth.
