A. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

On October 11, 2012 the Nunavut Water Board (Board) distributed Agnico-Eagle Mines Ltd.'s (AEML) application to renew their Meadowbank Exploration Project's Type B water licence. Agnico-Eagle Mines Ltd. are requesting a five year licence renewal beginning in February 2013. No changes to licence terms and conditions have been proposed. A licence renewal is required to allow continued exploration work in the project area which consists of prospecting, trenching, drilling, and geophysical activities.

B. RESULTS OF REVIEW

On behalf of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC), the following comments/ recommendations are submitted for the Board's consideration,

1. General

- AANDC have no issues with the renewal of AEML's water licence.

2. Trenching activities

The submitted application makes reference to trenching activities within the project area. The licence requirement for AEML to submit a trenching plan at least 60 days prior to beginning any trenching operations should continue to apply (Part F, Item 9 of the current licence). According to submitted annual reports, no trenching activities have occurred on site to date.
