RE: NWB2MEA/TR/H1- CUMBERLAND RESOURCES LTD. REVISED FUEL TRANSPORT AND STORAGE MANAGEMENT PLAN

Dear Richard:

The Department of Environment (DOE) has reviewed the revised fuel transport and storage management plan submitted by Cumberland Resources Ltd. for the Meadowbank Gold Project. Based on the Government of Nunavut *Spill Contingency Planning and Reporting Regulations* and *A Guide to the Spill Contingency Planning and Reporting Regulations*, the DOE has the following comments and recommendations to make.

- A list of fuel quantities of different fuel types stored on site should be included in the plan. There is no mention of it in the plan.
- The site map is intended to illustrate the facility relationship to other areas
 that may be affected by the spill. The site map is insufficient in details, and
 it should be scaled large enough to include the names of various facilities
 on site, culverts, drainage patters, and any nearby bodies of water.
- The disposal plan of contaminants is not adequate, and it should include disposal sites approved to accept wastes.
- A description of the training provided to employees to respond to a spill should be included in the plan as well. A sound training program is necessary when one deals with an emergency situation.
