Several elements of the original license as renewed require amendment to cover the period of the license:

- An all weather road under application will cross a small intermittent stream immediately north of the Meliadine West Gold Project camp; the bridge will not encroach on the stream, disturb the bank, nor impede normal flows.
- The drilling program may possibly use up to four drills.
- The camp will accommodate from 25 to 50 persons (previous license application had 25-40).
