We have attempted to answer all questions or comments directly, in the context and scale of the work being proposed and for which permission is being applied for. Due to the timing and limited scale of the proposed program, there will be little change in the level of activity in the camp itself and the camp activities. The main change for the camp will be working through the fall and winter months.

It is important to re-iterate that the program as laid out is a short term project of limited impact, that may or may not lead to the full scale development of the Tiriganiaq deposit. In this context, we have designed the program to minimize impact on the environment, while maximizing the benefit of what we are trying to do. We have also designed the program for success.
