RE: Application to Amend License 2BB-MEL0914 for an Extension of the Underground Exploration and Bulk Sample Program – Meliadine Gold Project

Yesterday, March 2, I emailed most of the documents relating to the above noted amendment request. What was not emailed were the Aquatic Synthesis Report, 2009 and the Terrestrial Baseline Synthesis Report, 2009. They are simply too large to email. These can be found on the attached CD along with all the documents sent by email. You will note I split the synthesis reports and other large documents into sections less than 3 megabytes wherever possible. This will make it easier for you to email the documents should you wish. There remain a couple of figures that exceed 3 megabytes and there is little I can do to make them smaller.

The two synthesis documents, prepared by Golder Associates, bring together all the biophysical reports prepared on the Meliadine Gold Project from 1997 to 2009 inclusive. All the data from the earlier reports can now be found in the single reports on the aquatic environment and the terrestrial environment. You should note that these reports do not describe impacts; they simply compile what was measured in the environment around the Meliadine Gold Project. These documents will be used extensively in preparing the upcoming draft EIS.

The CD sent to you earlier in February 2010 should be discarded as the attached CD has more documents and improvements have been made to some of the figures. (The earlier CD can be found inside the back cover of the bound document you should have received by now.)

Ten figures can be found on the CD. These apply equally to NIRB's Part 2 form and also to the NWB's advanced exploration questionnaire. I have kept them separate from the reports for ease of printing.

This concludes the amendments Comaplex has requested of the Nunavut Water Board. The three amendments are:

- 1) An increase in allowable water use from 90 m<sup>3</sup>/day to 290m<sup>3</sup>/day;
- 2) Geotechnical drilling within 31 metres of water; and
- An Extension of the Underground Exploration and Bulk Sample Program.
