Dear Mr. Roach,

Re: Waste disposal at the Rankin Inlet community dump by WMC International Ltd.

This memorandum is a formal request to continue in 2001 our practise of disposing non-combustible materials from WMC's Meliadine Lake exploration camp in the Rankin Inlet dump. We are requesting permission to deposit four different types of waste:

1. Solid waste from camp and operations like tin cans and other non-burnable domestic garbage that remain following incineration at the camp incinerator.
2. Frozen drill cuttings recovered from drilling operations on lake ice before spring break-up.
3. Rock cuttings recovered while cutting the drill core for the purpose of sampling.
4. Scrap metal from repairs to exploration equipment.

All waste will be transferred in 45 gallon barrels with lids wired in place. None of the waste to be transferred to the dump will contain any hazardous materials. While travelling conditions permit, the waste materials will be transported overland. In the summer the non-combustible garbage from the Meliadine Lake camp will be brought in by helicopter.
