**Re: Notice of Part 4 Screening for Meliadine Resources Ltd.'s "Meliadine East"**  
**Project Proposal**

Dear Mr. Roger March:

On April 7, 2008 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received Meliadine Resources Ltd.'s (Meliadine Resources) *Meliadine East* Project Proposal from the Kivalliq Inuit Association (KIA). Also on April 7, the NIRB received a positive conformity determination (Keewatin Regional Land Use Plan) from the Nunavut Planning Commission for this project proposal. The NIRB has assigned this project proposal file number **08EN043**. Upon a preliminary completeness check, NIRB determined that there was insufficient information to conduct a Part 4 screening. On April 11, 2008 NIRB requested Meliadine Resources provide the required information on or before April 18, 2008.

On April 23, 2008 NIRB received the requested information from Meliadine Resources.

This project is located in the Keewatin Region of Nunavut, 15 km north of the Hamlet of Rankin Inlet. The purpose of the proposed diamond drilling program is to discover gold deposit area on the Meliadine East property. The proposed project would be conducted from June to September 2008.

The project proposal includes the following activities/components:

- Campsite renovation (operation was authorized by KVL204J31);
- Helicopter operation for drop-offs and pick-ups of site personnel and site supplies;
- Geological mapping and prospecting;
- Diamond drilling (20-30 holes, approximately 4000 m);
- Fuel storage;
- Waste disposal; and
- Drill site restoration upon the close of the field season.

NIRB is copying interested Parties and municipalities most affected by the project proposal with this letter, and we invite interested persons to comment directly to the NIRB by **May 14, 2008**.


NIRB would like Parties to provide comments regarding:

- Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic and socio-economic effects; and if so, why;
- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
