Re: Notice of Part 4 Screening for Agnico-Eagle Mines Ltd.'s "All-Weather Road" project proposal

Dear John Witteman:

On February 6, 2011 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received Agnico-Eagle Mines Ltd.'s (AEM) "All-Weather Road" project proposal. On February 16, 2011 the NIRB received a request from the Kivalliq Inuit Association (KIA) to screen this project proposal. On April 1, 2011 the NIRB received a positive conformity determination (Keewatin Regional Land Use Plan) from the Nunavut Planning Commission for this project proposal. The NIRB has assigned this project proposal file number 11RN017.

The proposed project would be located in Kivalliq region between Rankin Inlet and the Meliadine Gold Project. AEM is proposing to develop a public all-weather access road in order to support the underground exploration and bulk sample project at the Tiriganiaq deposit at the Meliadine Gold Property. The program is proposed to take place over the winter season from June 2011 to May 2012.

The proposed project activities include:

- Development of a public all-weather access road connecting with an existing municipality road in Rankin Inlet and continuing to the Meliadine Property. The allweather access road would cross Char River, Meliadine River and 10 ephemeral streams and would include:
 - Replacement of existing bridge across Char River with a single-span bridge [29.5 metres (m)]
 - o Construction of a single-span bridge (29.5 m) across the Meliadine River
 - Ice bridge may be built to install the bridge girders in the Meliadine River
 - o Construction of a single-span bridge (23.5 m) across an unnamed ephemeral stream
 - Installation of stacked culverts at nine ephemeral streams

- Abutments and ancillary facilities
- Development of a spur road off the all-weather road to Meliadine Lake to be used by residents for recreational activities;
- Construction of an Emergency Airstrip to be used while the public all-weather access road is being constructed. Once access road completed, it will either be used as a laydown area or reclaimed.
- Development of esker and rock quarries;
- Transportation of fuel from either Rankin Inlet or Meliadine site to trucks and equipment working on road;
- Generation of wastes (combustible and non-combustible);
- Use of vans and/or pickups to transport personnel to work sites;
- Use of helicopters to transport personnel to Meliadine site;
- Use of existing Meliadine camp facilities including fuel storage, explosive storage, accommodation and incinerator facilities; commercial accommodations might also be used at Rankin Inlet; and
- After construction, road will be inspected every 2 weeks during the summer periods for erosion.

- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
