Re: AEM – Meliadine Camp, Nunavut Water License Obligations

Agnico-Eagle Mines (AEM) holds Water License 2BB-MEL0914 for the Meliadine Gold Project. The license issued by the Nunavut Water Board permits the discharge of grey water onto Inuit Owned Lands. Since as early as 2010, the Meliadine camp has had difficulties respecting its grey water discharge guidelines from sampling point MEL-7. KIA has had many conversations with various AEM representatives regarding the fact that the discharge from the camp has frequently exceeded guidelines. While we are aware that AEM has made some efforts to correct the problem, those efforts have fallen short of what is necessary to ensure compliance.

We are left with no alternative but to demand AEM immediately put into place a solution that will remedy this problem. By way of this letter, AEM has 30 days from the mailing date to completely revamp its grey water treatment system. If KIA is not assured of full and continued compliance, we will have no alternative but to take such steps necessary to stop the discharging of grey water onto IOL. We ask by way of coping both the Nunavut Water Board and Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada that they too monitor the Meliadine camp to ensure compliance with applicable licenses and permits.
