All fuel and useful material to be relocated to Rankin Inlet must be appropriately document and recorded for future tracking. A copy of the materials transferred should be included in the final closure report for the site.

Additional information KIA would like addressed in the Abandonment and Restoration Plan includes;

- a site monitoring plan following closure and reclamation activity; and
- a cost estimate for reclamation and site closure.
