PROJECT SCOPE:

The proposed "Arcadia Bay Property" project is located within the Kitikmeot region, approximately 160 kilometres (km) east of Kugluktuk, and 305 km southwest of Cambridge Bay. The Proponent intends to explore for economic gold deposits along the shore of Arcadia Bay, south of the Coronation Gulf. The program is proposed to take place seasonally from July 2017 to June 2022. The scope of this proposed project as identified by the NIRB includes the following undertakings, works or activities:

- 12 hole diamond drilling exploration
- Potential use of barge landing site at Coronation Gulf
- Use of fixed wing aircraft and helicopter as transportation
- Establishment of 12 person temporary camp
