PROJECT SUMMARY

Arctic Copper Corp staked 45 mineral claims in the Coppermine River area in 2015. The Company plans to carry out a small phase 1 exploration program in the summer of 2016. The program will take approximately 30 days to complete and will take place from mid-August to mid-September, or as soon as the necessary permits are obtained.

The program will consist of prospecting, geological mapping, rock and soil sampling, and a small drilling program. These activities are necessary to verify copper mineral occurrences found in the 1960's and earlier. Drilling will consist of approximately 10-15 holes carried out with a drill capable of drilling to a depth ranging from 75m to 200m. No exploration is planned to be conducted on Inuit Owned Lands.

A temporary camp will consist of eight 14ft x 16ft wood frame canvas tents with plywood floors. It will house 8 people and will be powered with a small generator. The camp will be taken down for the winter and removed when we are finished work in the area. The project will rely on helicopter transport to move crews and equipment around. Propane will be used for cooking and heating in the camp, gasoline will be used for the water pump, diesel for the drill and jet-B aviation fuel for the helicopter.

We will operate with utmost care and consideration for the environment and wildlife. We expect to use labour resources from the community of Kugluktuk and supply the necessary training for the work. If the project is successful, the size of the programs will increase in future years and provide greater opportunities for the people in Kugluktuk.
