RE: Licence 2BE-ANG0813 – Submission of 2010, 2011 and 2012 Annual Reports for the Angilak Project

Thank-you for your letter outlining Kivalliq Energy's submissions in support of the 2010, 2011, and 2012 Annual Reports required under Licence 2BE-ANG0813 and your request for more detailed information to add to the 2012 Annual Report submitted on March 1, 2013 as follows:

- An executive summary of the report in Inuktitut in accordance with Part B, Item 10 of the Licence's requirements;
- Details with respect to the wastes backhauled to Yellowknife;
- Photographs records of drill holes/sites for the 2012 reporting period;
- GPS coordinates for the location of drill holes/sites;
- Water use records for drilling and camp operations; and
- Incinerator use summary for the 2012 reporting period.

With regard to your reference to report deficiencies, please be advised that photographs and GPS coordinates for drill hole sites were included in Kivalliq Energy's 2012 NWB Annual Report submission, along with a summary of camp and drill water use as per the NWB Standard Report Form. The report also contained an up to date Spill Contingency Plan and Closure and Reclamation Plan. Please advise if you cannot locate this information and I will resend it promptly.

Although details on backhauled wastes and water use and incinerator logs are not specifically requested in the related Water Use Licence 2BE-ANG0813, I noticed that in previous years we submitted camp and drill water use logs and an incinerator use summary as supplemental

information. I will forward these records for 2012 along with details of wastes backhauled to Yellowknife in 2012.

With regard to providing an executive summary in Inuktitut, we do sincerely apologize for this oversight and will endeavor to provide this to the NWB without delay on or before September 28, 2013, along with the water use, incinerator and backhaul logs.
