Dear Jeff Ward:

On January 26, 2012 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received an application from Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC) for an amendment to Land Use Permit N2008C0026 for Kivalliq Energy Corporation's "Angilak" project. All documents received and pertaining to this project proposal include:

- *AANDC request for NIRB screening decision*;
- *AANDC form in English*;
- *Kivalliq Energy Corporation Cover Letter;*
- Non-Technical Summary in English and Inuktitut;
- Fuel Management Plan;
- *Spill Contingency Plan*;
- Closure Plan; and
- Maps.

The NIRB has undertaken a preliminary completeness check and finds that your project proposal does *not* contain sufficient information for the NIRB to permit proper screening. Specifically, the NIRB is requesting submission of the following information by **February 21, 2012:**

- Details regarding the proposed location of the ice-strip, including a map showing proposed location of the ice-strip in relation to the existing camp;
- Details on the method of supplies transport from the ice-strip to the camp (i.e. by helicopter or winter trail) as well as location of supplies storage and distance of transport if supplies to be stored outside of the existing camp areas; and

• GIS coordinates for all fuel storage sites as well as approximate amounts of fuel to be stored at each site during the upcoming field season.
