Dear Mr. Dwyer:

At your request, the Department of Culture, Language Elders and Youth (CLEY), Government of Nunavut, has reviewed the above-noted application. Our recommendations are limited to CLEY's mandate and follow.

Part of the ground truthing for this camp location should have included an archaeological site assessment. There are several archaeological sites within 10 km of the proposed camp location. Some of these archaeological sites are located on a lake, places which are good for camping now were most often good for camping in the past and therefore have high archaeological potential. Before CLEY can recommend approval for this project, proposed development areas should be assess by a professional permit archaeologist. A list of archaeological consultants who have worked in Nunavut is attached.

Attachment #1 is provided solely for the purpose of the proponent's land use activities as described in the land use application, and must otherwise be treated confidentially by the proponent.

The attached conditions specify plans and methods of site protection and restoration to be followed by the permittee if an archaeological site is encountered or disturbed in the course of the land use activity.
