## Technical Review Memorandum

## A. Background

The Angilak property is located 240 km southwest of Baker Lake in the Kivalliq Region of Nunavut. The Camp has five main buildings (Kitchen, Dry, Office, Core Storage and Pacto) and 16 tents for sleeping.

The Kivalliq Energy Corporation holds a valid water licence 2BE-ANG1318 which was issued by the Nunavut Water Board (NWB) on March 15, 2013.

This amendment application involves the following:

i) Increase in water use from 100m<sup>3</sup> to 300m<sup>3</sup> – This is as a result of the recent clarification of the definition of water use.

## B. Results of Review and Recommendations

AANDC Water Resources Division offers the following comments and recommendations for the Board's consideration.





- Block 6 of the Water Licence Amendment Application indicates that the Inuit Owned Lands (IOL) authorization from the Kivalliq Inuit Association is set to expire on August 1, 2014.
  - AANDC reminds the proponent to renew this authorization as soon as possible to avoid any project delays.
- Block 7 of the Water Licence Amendment Application states Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) conformity is attached; however the conformity that is attached is from 2008. Additionally an email dated April 28<sup>th</sup> from Kivalliq Energy Corp. to the NWB indicates that they have not heard back from NPC regarding conformity regarding this amendment.
  - AANDC recommends that the licensee provide to the NWB NPC's conformity determination as soon as it is known.
- Block 13 of the Water Licence Amendment Application indicates that the camp water source is New Yat Lake, however in the approved water license the camp water source is indicated as Nutaaq Lake and furthermore an inspection of the site carried out by AANDC states that the water license should be amended to indicate Angilak Lake as the camp water source.
  - AANDC recommends clarification on the name of the camp water source and its associated latitudinal and longitudinal coordinates.
- Continuing with Block 13 AANDC notes that the licensee has indicated that they intend to return 78.2 m³ of water to the source per day. AANDC could find no other details describing the return of water to the source within the application documents. AANDC recommends the licensee provide details on mitigation of potential impacts from the water to be returned to the source. These aspects would include, but are not limited to:
- i) Will the re-circulated water be heated?
- ii) By what method will the water be returned to the source? (directly or indirectly, please describe)
- iii) How will the licensee confirm that the water is of acceptable quality to return to the source. Will periodic sampling be required?

Additionally, the proponent should ensure when returning the water to the source that they do not cause:

- i) Erosion
- ii) Sedimentation
- iii) Re-suspension of lake bottom sediments
