RE: 2009 INAC FIELD INSPECTION AND REPORT BY K. ROBERTSON

LUP N2008C0026, ANGILAK PROJECT, YATHKYED LAKE

KIVALLIQ ENERGY CORPORATION

This letter is in response to your Field Inspection Report under LUP N2008C0026. We have reviewed your letter (dated January 18, 2010, received February 4, 2010) and the attached Inspection Report Form (dated July 25, 2009) and provide the following in response. First, please be advised that we cannot sign the Inspection Report Form that you sent due to concerns regarding accuracy and timing.

Incongruent Dates – Late Reporting

Although dated July 25, 2009, it is clear that comments and observations in this inspection report were added much later and after your visit to site. Some comments refer to events which had not yet taken place and in fact comprise part of a water licence inspection conducted by Andrew Keim when he visited the site on August 11, 2009. Kivalliq Energy responded to Mr. Keim's inspection report on November 11, 2009 and yet you make no mention of this in your letter dated January 18, 2010.

In addition, Kivalliq Energy was unaware of your inspection until we received your letter and inspection report six months later on February 4, 2010. We feel it's important to note that at the time of your inspection, the camp was not operational and the program had not yet started.

"Issues Identified during Inspection"

Campsite described as "dismantled and half erected":

This description implies dereliction. In fact, what you saw was a variety of wood frames and platforms used for different types of tents, neatly winterized and closed since 2008. You also note that the camp was in the same state on August 11, 2009 which is incorrect. At the time of Mr. Keim's inspection on August 11, the camp had been re-established and was fully operational.

Fuel barrels "scattered throughout the camp":

Fuel and empties were actually neatly clustered in rows and clearly marked with pickets behind camp. Although you note secondary containment was not in place during the winter hiatus, it was used at all fuelling stations while the camp was operational.

No records of water use:

Camp was closed during your inspection and your reference to a lack of record keeping is incorrect. Records were kept during operations, and they will be submitted as part of the annual report.

Waste disposal and kitchen grease trap:

Again, the camp was closed during your inspection.

Relocation notification:

It appears that you may be out of the loop on the status of camp amendments and relocation. An amendment application was submitted to INAC and the NWB to relocate the camp after the 2009 program. This was approved by INAC and NIRB in May 2009 and final approval from NWB/EC/DOE was just received on January 25, 2010. In addition, Mr. Keim was flown to the proposed new camp location for input during his site inspection.

Fuel spill:

Your reference to the fuel spill that occurred at site is misplaced given that the date on your inspection report form is July 25, well before the date the spill occurred. As well, your comments that the fuel spill "clean-up was insufficient" are unfair given that you never visited the actual spill site, and Mr. Keim only viewed it from afar. We believe our efforts were sufficient, we responded to this single-drum incident by notifying appropriate agencies, followed our approved Spill Plan and conducted follow-up water testing, the results of which indicated no presence of any hydrocarbons. This incident was fully documented and will comprise part of our annual report.

Companies like Kivalliq strive to operate responsibly and exceed conditions set out by regulators. However, the inspections and collaborative reporting noted herein seem neither impartial nor timely. We welcome a response to concerns regarding this inspection report, and look forward to a much more constructive and cooperative process with INAC.

The July 25, 2009 Inspection Report and photographs illustrating some of our comments are attached for reference.



On, July 25,2009 I conducted a field inspection at the above mentioned location.

Issues Identified during the inspection:

<u>Campsite:</u> The campsite was half dismantled and half erected. It was pointed out to me that there were plans to move this camp to another site but as of this inspection date and that of August 11th, 2009 (when Water Inspector Andrew Keim was at the site), the state of the camp was virtually the same.

<u>Fuel Storage:</u> There were at least 200 fuel barrels scattered throughout the camp site and that no secondary containment measurements was in use. It is a requirement that all fuel storage barrels be situated in secondary containment (such as portable berms) in order to protect the environment.

<u>Water:</u> WRO Keim noted that there had been no record of water usage at the camp. This situation will have to change in the upcoming 2010 inspection season.

<u>Waste:</u> There were no great problems noted with the waste disposal system although a kitchen grease trap should be installed for the up coming season.

<u>Drilling activities:</u> Nothing observed during the July 25th inspection.

<u>Comments:</u> Notification of relocating this camp must be sent to our offices and 48 hours of notice of commencement of activities is also a requirement. We must also be advised 10 days in advance of the end of activities at the site. You can contact me at the numbers listed below.
