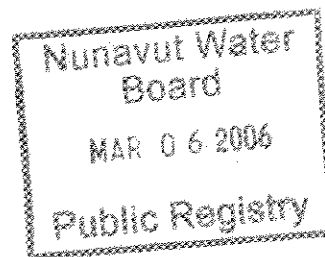

Spill kits were placed adjacent to and beneath all fuel heating drums. Extra fuel was cached at the helicopter landing area approximately 200 metres away from the Lake Shore. Up to 18 drums (diesel and Jet B) were stored at this cache along with a spill kit and additional absorbent pads.
