IME contracts wildlife monitors/ field assistants through the HTO. The wildlife monitor/field assistants worked with the geologist prospecting on the project area. The duties included wildlife monitoring and recording wildlife sightings. IME provided training on helicopter safety, GPS use, map reading, and prospecting. The qualifications for the wildlife monitors/field assistants is a valid firearms license, firearm and ammunition and good local knowledge of the area. In 2006, three persons were hired through the HTO for a total of 29 man-days.

Community Liaison Representative

IME has had a full time community liaison representative (CLR) in the community since September, 2006. The CLR assists with the organization of community information sessions, translation, and community members can directly contact the CLR if they have any concerns that they would like IME to address. The CLR has helped IME to form a transparent relationship with community members so that community members are well informed on IME activities in the area. The CLR also represented IME at the 2007 Nunavut Mining Symposium in Iqaluit.

Translator

IME has hired a translator for all community information sessions to ensure that all community members can fully participate in the presentation. IME also ensures that a translator is present when meeting with various community groups and associations.
