## **Technical Review Memorandum**

## Background

The Blue Caribou Project was located in the Kitikmeot Region of Nunavut 440 km South of Cambridge Bay and 490 km northeast of Yellowknife.

The camp site, at Blue Caribou, consisted of 5 structures. These included tents for sleeping (5), kitchen tent (1), office tent (1) and a dry tent (1) as well as an emergency shelter close to the drill rigs. There was also a fuel cache on site.

Site location coordinates are as follows: 65°13'57"N, 106°37'06"W.

All structures associated with this site have been removed.

## Recommendations/Comments

The Department of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada, Water Resources Division finds the cancellation application complete and recommends that the above referenced license not be cancelled/ closed until a Water Resource Officer completes a final inspection of the site and provides confirmation that no compliance issues are outstanding with the project.

AANDC could find no record of cancellation fee being paid. AANDC recommends that the Nunavut Water Board verify that the cancellation fee has been received.
