Good Day Kris,

As the tech reviewing your application, I apologize for the delay in reviewing your file as I have been on annual leave for the past few weeks. In the new application for the Bache Peninsula Coal Project, it was stated that a camp location will be determined during the 2009 field program. Given the current date and minimum timelines of at least 30 days for public notification and then a final technical review/Board decision it is fairly safe to say that a Licence cannot be issued until mid October.

My question is, has a camp location been selected for remainder of the project? If so and the 2009 field season will not last beyond mid October, I am recommending that the GPS locations for the camp and the camp water source be provided to the NWB prior to going out for a 30 day review.

Also, if possible the Abandonment and Restoration Plan should be updated to make it specific to the expected camp. The Spill Contingency Plan should also include a camp site map showing structures and fuel caches in relation to local water bodies and replace the NU Spill Report form with the updated NT/NU Spill Report form (available on the FTP site).

However, if Weststar Resources Corp. has not chosen a camp location at this point and would like a licence in place asap, please advice and we can get the file out for a public comment period. Please note that the NWB would still require an NPC Conformity Determination and a NIRB

Screening Decision Prior to issuing a Licence. An amendment could then be applied for at a later date once all required information is available to allow for a camp.
