

DIAMONDEX RESOURCES LTD.
Brodeur Peninsula Project, Baffin Island, NU
Non-technical Project Summary
Submitted November 2007

Diamondex Resources Ltd. (Diamondex) wishes to relocate its exploration base from its current St. Joseph Camp location, to better support its continued diamond exploration efforts on the Brodeur Peninsula of Baffin Island, NU, in 2008.

The move will mitigate limited seasonal water access relative to the short-lived snowmelt availability which creates the St. Joseph River, and preclude the possibility of negative environmental impacts owing to the close adjacency of the current camp location to the said river.

The new camp will consist of 10 wooden 14X16 tent frames to be used as sleeping quarters and office, as well as a 14X32 weather haven tent to be used as a kitchen. A small wooden lean-to structure will be erected to house the generator unit, along with a small wooden outhouse.

Camp will have a capacity of up to 20 people and house permanent and seasonal Diamondex employees, including geologists, field assistants and support personnel, as well as contractors such as aircrew, geophysicists and drillers. It is the wish of Diamondex Resources to continue hiring the highest percentage of Nunavut residents possible and to maintain close relations with communities surrounding its exploration activities on the Brodeur Peninsula, including Ikpiarjuk (Arctic Bay) and Qausuittuq (Resolute Bay). As in 2007, Diamondex will visit these communities to provide updates on the project and a chance for residents and other parties to voice their concerns and express their opinions with regards to the exploration program.

It is also the mandate of Diamondex to maintain strict environmental policies, both for its employees and its contractors. Land stewardship is an essential part of its exploration programs. The current St. Joseph Camp location will be reclaimed to meet the standards described in Kennecott/Diamondex's Abandonment and Restoration Plan.
