

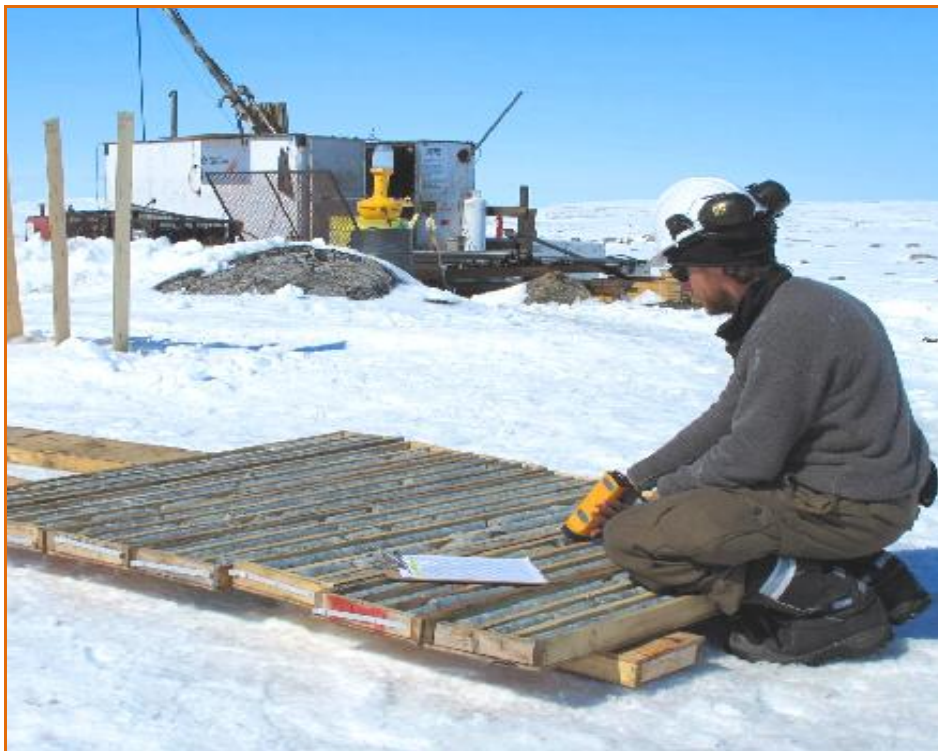
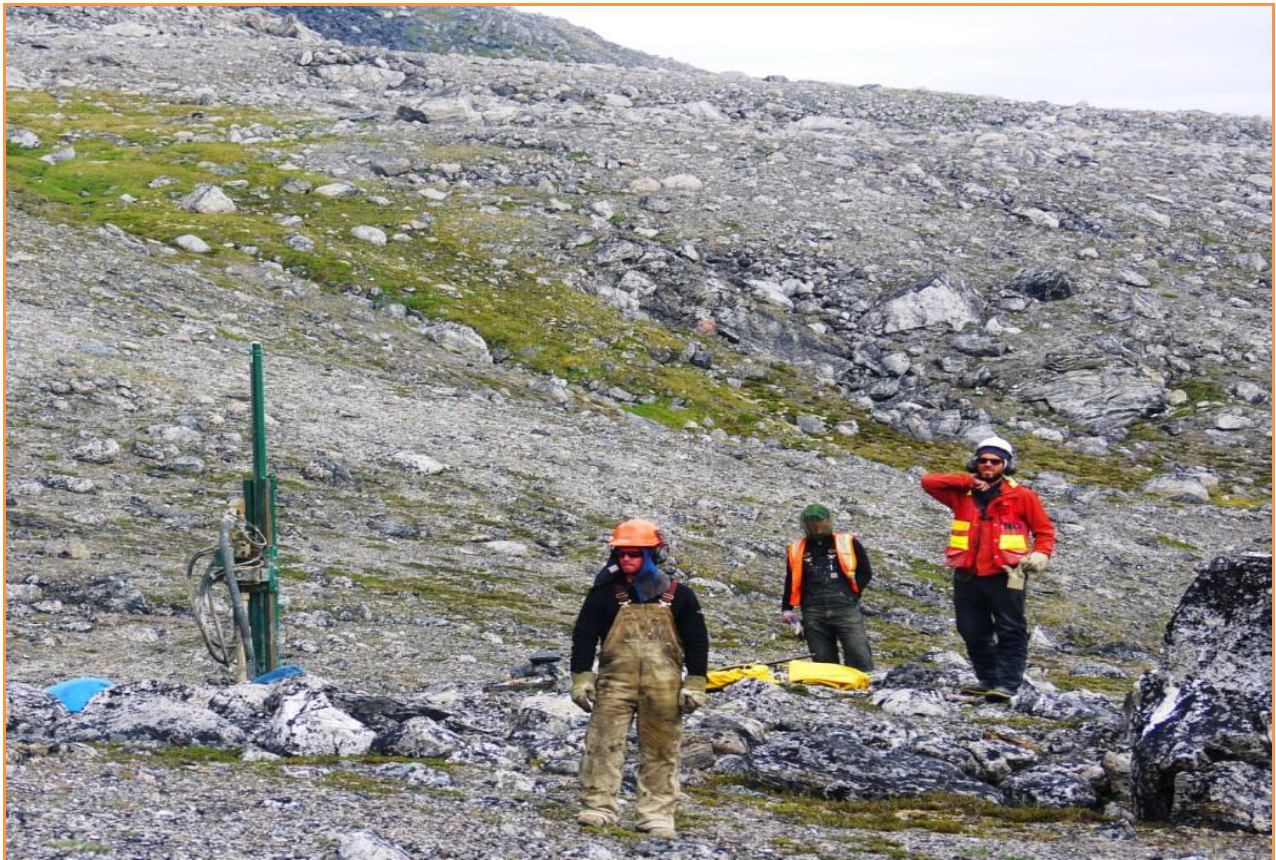

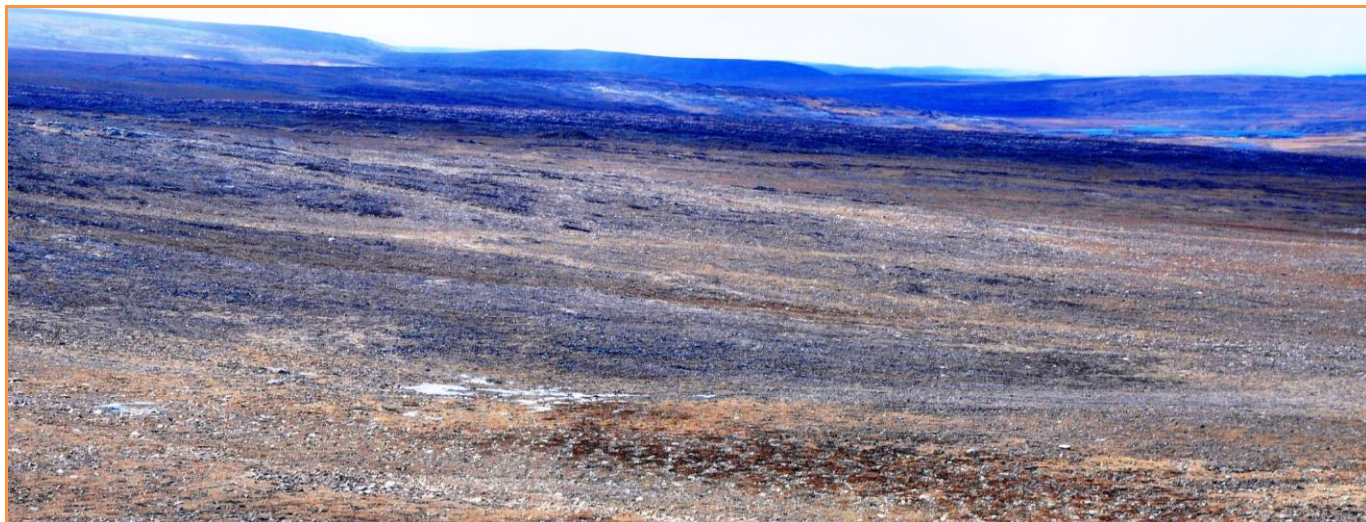

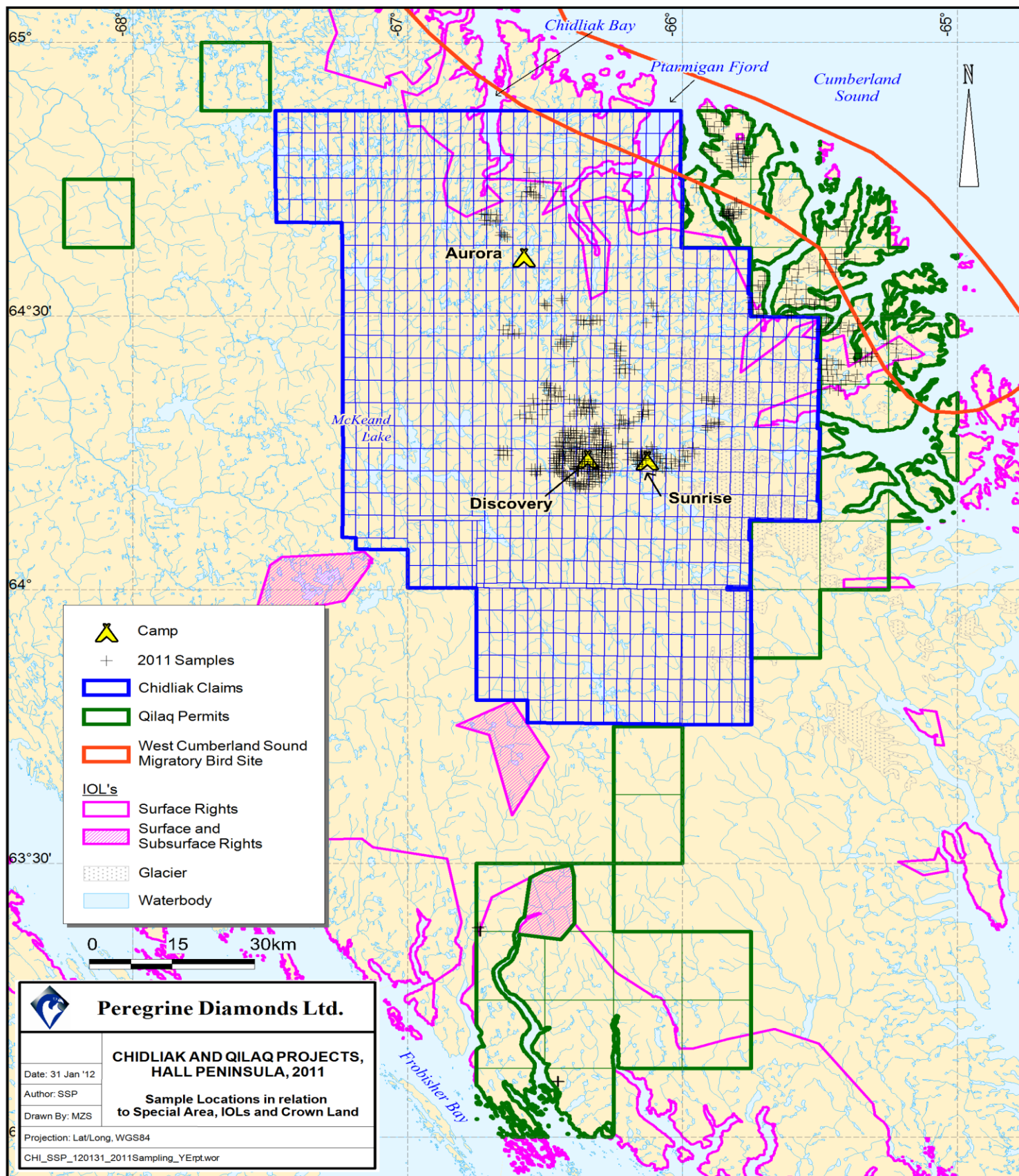

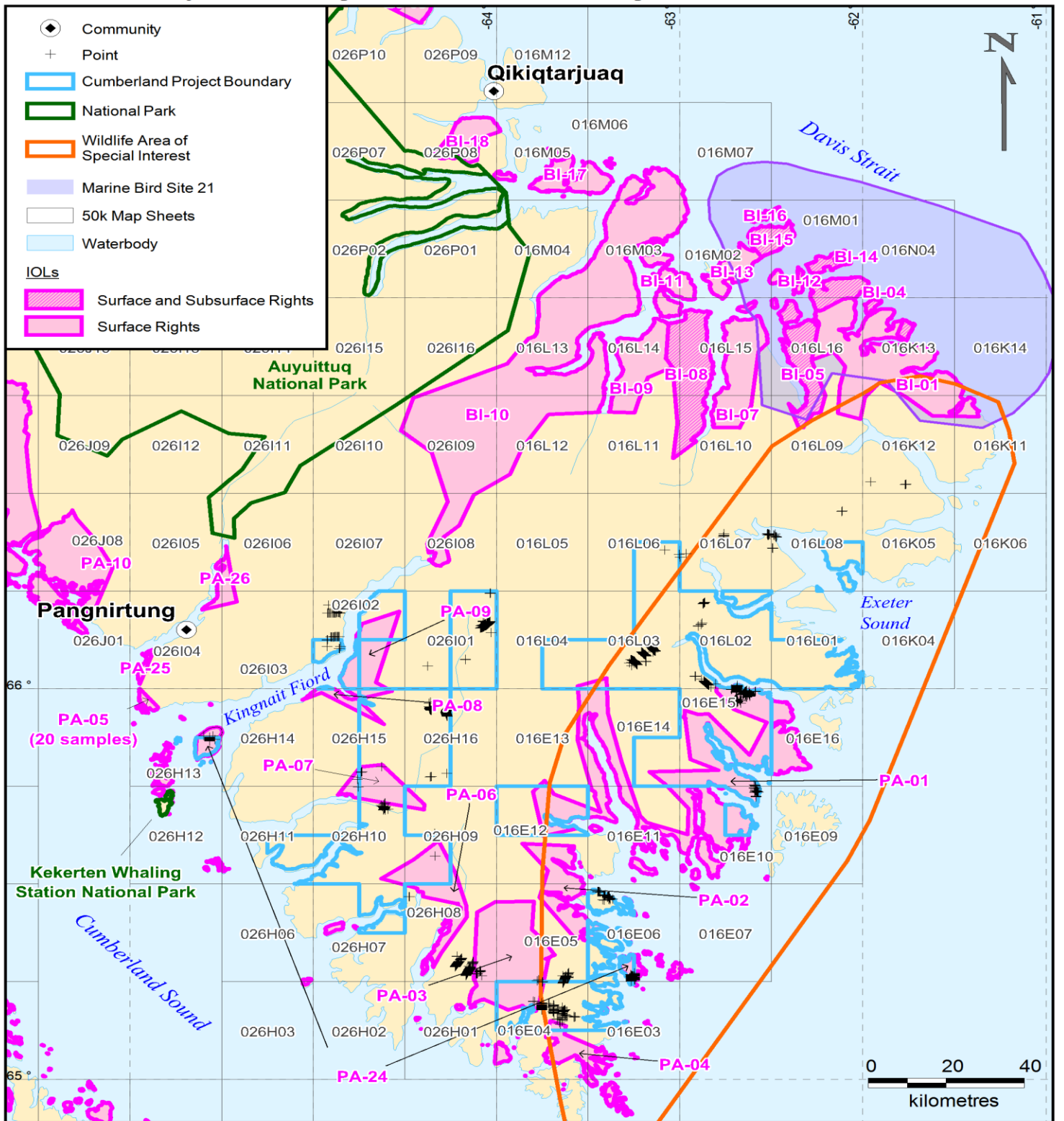

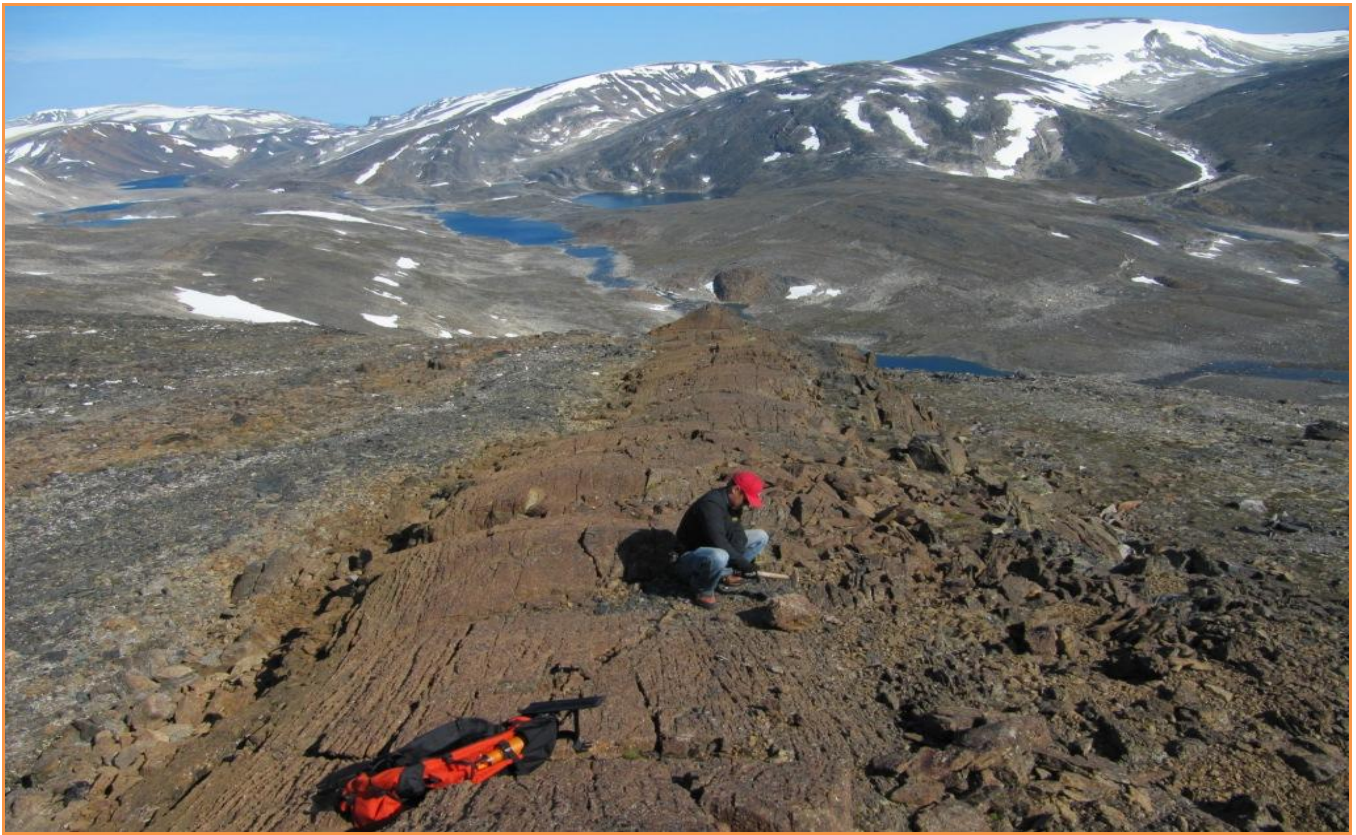
ABOVE: 447 samples were collected on Chidliak, with 2 of those collected on an IOL; 591 samples were collected on Qilaq, with 272 of those collected on IOLs (QIA Land Licence #Q10L1C008-Extension). A total of 61 samples were collected within the boundaries of the Canadian Wildlife Service Migratory Bird Site #29.

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Cumberland Project - 2011 Sample Locations in Relation to Special Areas and Inuit and Crown Lands



ABOVE: 877 samples were collected on Cumberland, with 246 of those collected on six IOLs (QIA Land Licence #Q10L1C008-Extension). No samples were collected within Canadian Wildlife Service Marine Migratory Bird Site #21. Polar bears spotted aerially in or near the coastal Wildlife Area of Special Interest (5 individuals and one group sighting) were avoided and recorded in the project Wildlife Log.

ABOVE: Closure of Cumberland Project fuel cache – 05 August 2011. (This is second season of use of this fuel-cache location in PA-07).

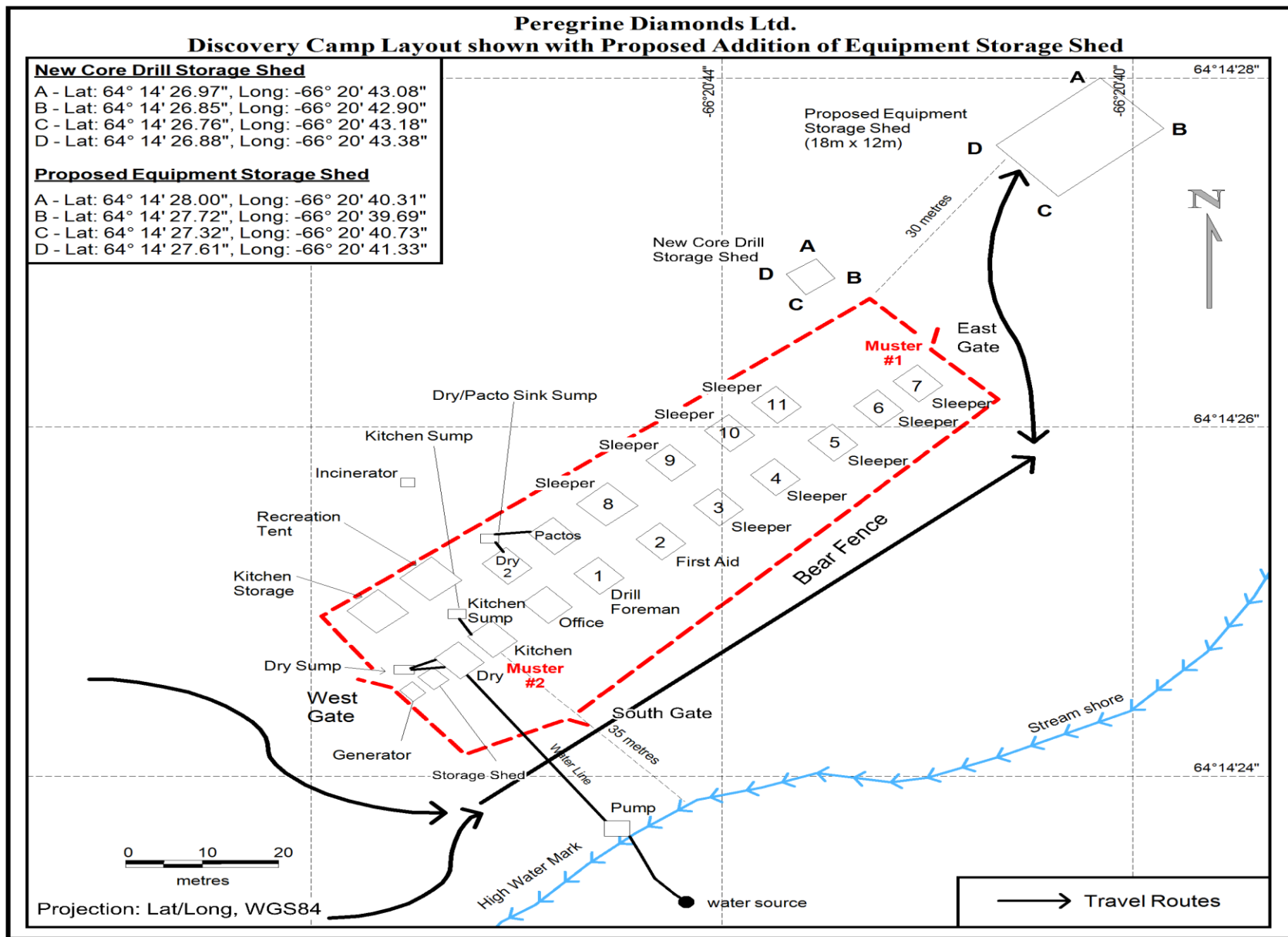

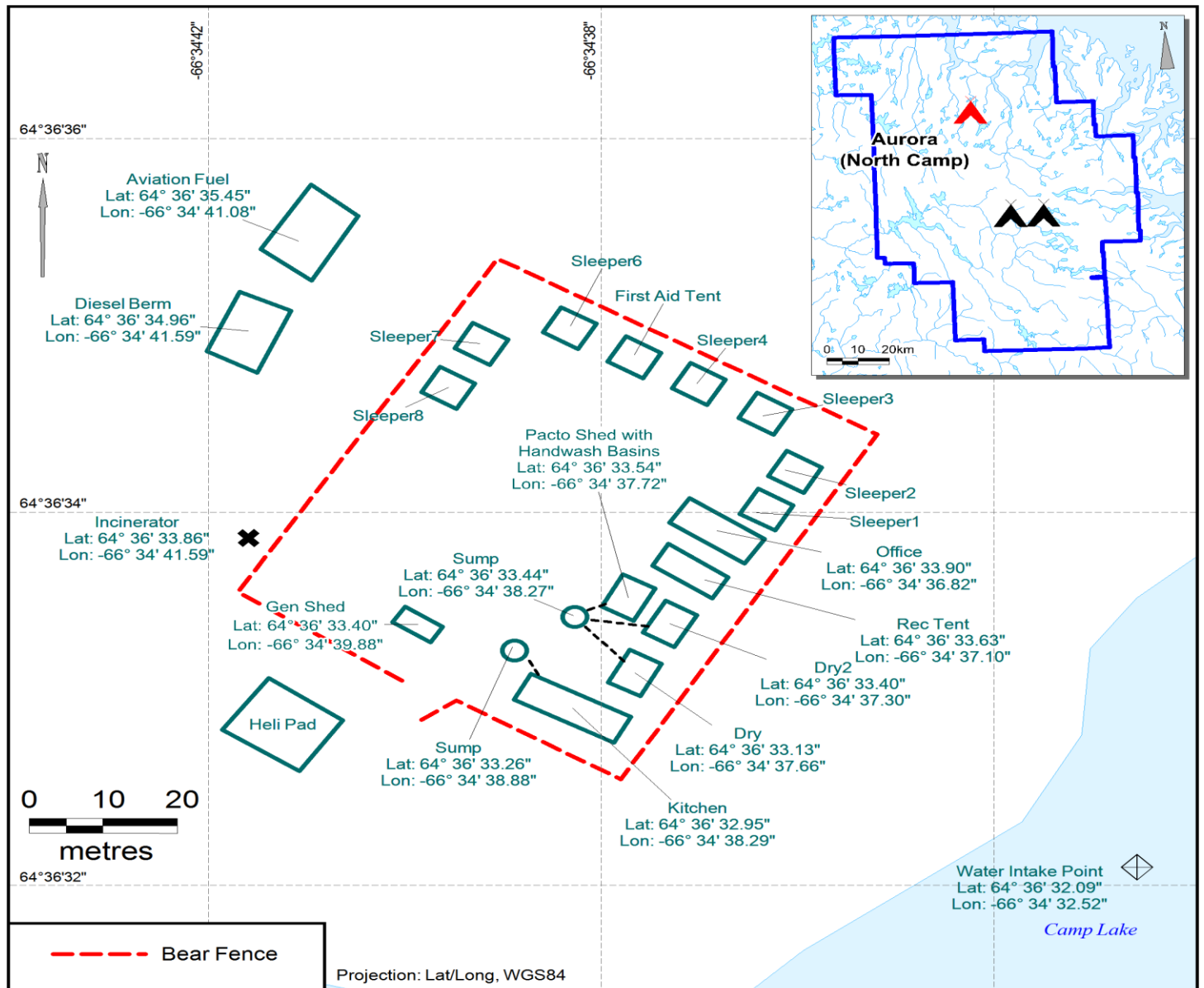
