In September 2018, Peregrine Diamonds Ltd. (Peregrine) was purchased by De Beers Canada Inc. (De Beers). Peregrine is now a wholly owned subsidiary of De Beers.

No field work was conducted in 2018, no water was utilized and no waste water generated.

Peregrine currently holds water use licence 2BE-CHI1823. The annual water use fee for this water use licence is \$897.90 based upon fees set out in Section 12(1)(b) of the Nunavut Waters Regulations (SOR/2016-69).

Maximum water allocation = 246 m³ per day Total days in the year = 365 Charge per cubic meter = \$0.01 per m³

Total annual fee: \$897.90 (246m³ x 365 days x \$0.01 per m³)

The sample was sent for analysis at Parcel Laboratories Ltd. in Ottawa, Ontario. The sample was analysed for hydrocarbons in soil and the results compared to the Nunavut soil quality guidelines. The results were over the PHC F1 and F2 criteria but at manageable levels. Additional sampling and remediation will take place during the summer of 2019. The analysis certificate from Parcel Laboratories (#1840538) is attached.
