Dear Richard Dwyer

The Department of Culture, Language, Elders and Youth (CLEY) has reviewed the documentation for the amended and approved application of Peregrine Diamonds Ltd. for waste water disposal, and for general uses associated with exploration activities on the Hall Peninsula.

The department does not object to the amended application as approved. However, the department has concerns about the prevalence of archaeology in the proponent's area of activity. In relation to the amendment, the proponent's property is in the vicinity of seven known archaeological sites which are approximately 19 km west of the new drilling location. In addition, CLEY issued a 2010 Archaeologist's Permit to Thomson Heritage Consultants to continue the archaeological assessment of the Chidlak project area.

All archaeological and palaeontological sites in Nunavut are protected by law. Should any site be encountered, the proponent must contact the Department of Culture, Language, Elders and Youth.
