

Item 9 of Water License Application: Description of Undertaking

The purpose of the program is to explore for copper mineralization using airborne and surface geophysical surveys, geochemical soil and rock sampling surveys, prospecting, core drilling, trenching and geological mapping on the company's claims. Approx. 3,000 soil samples will be collected and approx 500 line kilometers of airborne electromagnetic and ground magnetics surveys will be conducted. In addition, approx 2,000 metres of core diamond drilling in 25-30 holes and 500metres of trenching to evaluate and verify previously discovered copper deposits. The drilling will take place primarily on the company's TCC5 and RML15 claims. Trenching will be comprised of numerous short trenches on various historic showings for an aggregate total length not exceeding 500 metres. We anticipate a small portion of the drilling to take place during the summer of 2014 and trenching and geophysics to be done in 2015. See the attached maps, figures 1-4 for reference.

A seasonal camp for approximately 9 people will be set up most likely on claim RML 28, although we are discussing the possibility of having it on IOL at the south end of the Hope Lake airstrip. It will consist of wood framed canvas tents with plywood floors. Transport will be via Helicopter stationed in camp and supplies brought in by fixed wing aircraft from Yellowknife and Kugluktuk. When the program is completed for the 2014 field season, we will pack up the tents and supplies and store on site or in Kugluktuk until needed for the 2015 season.

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
