A. BACKGROUND

On October 4, 2016 the Nunavut Water Board (NWB or Board) provided notification to interested parties that Tundra Copper Corporation had submitted a Type "B" water licence renewal application # 2BE-COP1416, for the Coppermine Project.

The applicant has requested a renewal License issued for their activities related to exploration that include prospecting, geological mapping, geophysical survey, and diamond drilling activities.

Interested parties were asked to review the water licence application and provide technical comments by November 4, 2016.

B. RESULTS OF REVIEW

INAC Water Resource Division submits the following comments/recommendations to the Nunavut Water Board for consideration:

1. Past inspection reports

Comment:

Upon reviewing past INAC inspection reports, the following points are noted from an inspection report dated August 13, 2016 referring to Part H of the current water licence:

- The camp appears to be inactive.
- Several of the structures are in disrepair.
- Fuel caches show signs of internal fuel and grease spill and the secondary containment appears to be failing.



- The secondary containment for the airfield fuel cache also shows signs of failure and contains a significant amount of fuel and grease contaminated water.

Recommendation 1:

INAC recommends the licensee comply with all current terms and conditions of their water licence. INAC also suggests that the licensee pay special attention to secondary containment of their fuel caches, and recommends the licensee perform regular inspection of the fuel caches even when the camp is inactive.

2. Licensee request

Comment:

The licensee requested a renewal issuance of four years (until 2020). INAC is concerned with some of the comments noted on the current inspection report, dated August 13, 2016 regarding secondary containment of fuel caches and possible fuel spills.

Recommendation 2:

INAC recommends a renewal issuance of two years in order to give the licensee time to rectify the issues in the current inspection report.

3. Abandonment and Reclamation Plan

- 2. 2BE-COP1416 New Licence

Comment:

Item 5 of the 'Camp Final Abandonment and Restoration Plan' states that "all wooden structures, including floors, will either be burned or removed".

Recommendation 3:

INAC recommends the licensee follow the general terms and conditions found in 'Part D: Conditions Applying to Waste Disposal' of the current water licence, if the licensee plans to burn any kind of material or waste during the abandonment process, and ensure that the ash and wastes resulting from the burning thereof are contained and controlled so as not to impact nearby water bodies.
