Dear Ms Beaulieu,

Please accept this correspondence as an official request to close the file on the above referenced type “B” water license.

This license (and its predecessors 2BE-COR0205 and 2BE-COR0508) authorized water use and waste disposal for two camp locations and exploration activities, including drilling, on Stornoway Diamond Corporation’s landholdings in the Coronation Gulf region of Nunavut.


In September of 2008 one of the camp facilities, the “Jubilee” camp, was demobilized and abandonment and restoration activities at the site were completed.

The “Eureka” camp, the second camp facility authorized under this license, then went on to be covered under 2BE-CGP01012 when it was re-opened to support a short, six week drill program conducted during the summer of 2011.

I have attached a copy of the Final Land Use Report that was submitted to AANDC for the closure of the land use permit associated with this project as it details the full history of all activities conducted under the authority of 2BE-COR0608, including the abandonment and restoration activities that were performed at the Jubilee camp site.
