

This amendment request to Water Licence 2BE-CPM2527 is to add two small temporary exploration camps and to allow additional drillholes within the existing project area and a small set of newly staked contiguous claims. The nature and scale of work remain consistent with the current licence. Field crews will be small and seasonal, camps will be used intermittently for short campaigns, and there are no in-water works or permanent facilities.

Water management will continue to follow conservative practices. Total daily water use for all purposes will be not more than 299 m³/day, though typical use will be much lower and vary with activity. Diamond drilling may use up to 30 m³/day per active rig; and RC drilling is dry. Camp needs are generally up to 10 m³/day per active camp with a maximum of two camps. Withdrawals will be taken from nearby lakes and streams using screened intakes. Seasonal lake drawdown will be limited to not more than 0.10 m and stream withdrawals to not more than ten percent of instantaneous low flow, with volumes distributed among sources and recorded for annual reporting.

Waste and fuel handling will follow the existing plans and setbacks. Greywater will be settled and discharged to a sump at least 31 m from the ordinary high water mark, then decommissioned before licence expiry. Sewage will be managed by bag-and-burn incinerating toilets or sealed containment and flown to an approved facility. Fuel will be stored with secondary containment and all materials will be removed at demobilization. Drill sites will be progressively reclaimed during the program.

The licence expiry remains 13 April 2027 and closure activities will be completed before expiry. Annual reporting will continue under Part B using the Nunavut Water Board standardized form and will include camp-related water use and waste volumes. Updated maps are provided in the attachments.
