Mineral Exploration in the Hayes River – Committee Bay Region

Committee Bay Resources Ltd., and predecessor companies, have been exploring for economic mineral deposits in the Committee Bay region for more than 10 years. We believe that the under-explored Committee Bay Greenstone Belt has the potential to host world class gold deposits. Committee Bay Resources Ltd. is committed to cooperation with local communities, Inuit associations and all governments to ensure mutual benefit from mineral discoveries without adversely affecting the natural way of wildlife, people and the land.

The purpose of our activities under the land use license is to evaluate the potential for economic concentrations of minerals within the 56 J, K, O and P map sheets. Our activities will include sampling, mapping, prospecting, claim staking, geophysics and lake water sampling on Inuit Owned Land (IOL) surface rights parcels. The same forms of work will be conducted on federal lands as well as selected drilling of high priority targets. Currently, several drill-ready targets have been identified but other occurrences may be brought to the drill-ready stage during the 2004 summer program.

Committee Bay Resources Ltd. maintains two camps (Hayes and Crater Lake camps) along the Committee Bay Greenstone Belt to support exploration activities. The Crater camp will only be used for a maximum of 2 weeks this summer while the Hayes camp will be occupied steadily from about mid-March until the end of August. We are proposing an expansion of the Hayes camp to facilitate a larger crew and more equipment than has been typical in past years. We are also proposing the construction of two small, new camps (10-15 people maximum) comprising 4-6 wood shacks in the southwest portion of the belt to improve our exploration efficiency in these more remote locations.

During the winter months our activities will be supported by heavy machinery, snow machines and helicopters and then solely by helicopters once the snow is gone.

2004 Exploration Plan

In 2004, the Committee Bay project plans to spend approximately \$7.1 million dollars on an extensive exploration program covering most of the Committee Bay greenstone belt, Nunavut. The planned 2004 exploration program is anticipated to comprise an 8000m drill program, localized airborne geophysical surveys (2 small grids – approximately 200 line kilometers each), geological mapping program (6 total at scale between 1:50,000 and 1:10,000), a lake water sampling program, a till (frost boil) sampling program, and reconnaissance prospecting/sampling, and staking. Some baseline environmental work is also planned.

The planned 2004 exploration program is logistically complex and will comprise winter (Phase 1) and summer (Phase 2) work programs. Phase 1 will comprise drilling only and will be conducted at the Three Bluffs and Four Hills prospects. The remainder of the work summarized above, including additional regional drilling, will be conducted during the summer (Phase 2) work program. It is currently anticipated that the Phase 1 program will commence in mid-February with an overland mobilization of fuel and equipment from Baker Lake for the construction of an airstrip in proximity to the Hayes River camp (overland land use license is pending through the contractor). The ice airstrip will be suitable for landing by Hercules aircraft that will be utilized to position the majority of the equipment, fuels and supplies required for the 2004 program. The Hercules mobilization is planned for the week of March 10-17, 2004. The Phase 1 program is anticipated to continue until mid May 2004.

Upgrading of the Hayes River camp and drill mobilization to the Three Bluffs prospect are planned for the second half of March, after which fuel and equipment will be shuttled overland (to be completed on the contractor's land use permit) to the Four Hills area for camp construction and drilling. An equipment and fuel cache will be kept on shore, at the ice strip, during the actual process of moving this equipment and fuel to the appropriate camps or drill location. The Hayes River camp will be winterized and its capacity will be increased to accommodate up to 30 people. A temporary camp (Dore Camp) will be constructed to accommodate up to 10 people and will facilitate the drilling that is planned for the Four Hills prospect near the end of the Phase 1 program. Later in the year, a new permanent camp (Bullion Camp) will be constructed south of the Dore campsite in order to facilitate planned exploration work throughout the southwest portion of the Committee Bay belt. The bullion camp will be constructed to accommodate up to 15 people.

The planned 2004 drill program requires the mobilization of 3 new drills to the site that will join the single drill that is currently at the Hayes River camp. Throughout the 2004 program, no more than 2 drills will be utilized at a time. The Phase 1 drill program will consist almost entirely of drilling at Three Bluffs utilizing the drill that is currently on site (to be skid mounted) and the new 25A drill (track buggy mounted). Of the remaining two new (light weight) drills, one will be transported to Four Hills and will be utilized to complete a short drill program at that prospect toward the end of Phase 1, while the second will be transported to the Hayes camp and will be stored for use during the Phase

2 (summer) program. The old 25A drill currently on site will be de-mobilized following the completion of the Phase 1 program.

Phase 2 of the 2004 exploration program is expected to commence in late June and continue to the end of August 2004 and will be based out of the upgraded Hayes River camp and the new Bullion camp. The Phase 2 drill program is planned for completion between early July and early August 2004. During Phase 2, drilling will be conducted based out of the new Bullion camp at Four Hills and surrounding areas utilizing the lighter drill that is to be mobilized to the area during Phase 1. In addition, the second lighter drill rig that was mobilized during Phase 1 to the Hayes Camp will be activated and will be utilized to drill additional holes around the Three Bluffs occurrence as well as other regional targets. The new 25A drill may be utilized to complete some additional drill holes at the Three Bluffs occurrence, but will most likely be deactivated and stored at the Hayes Camp.

2004 Exploration Details and Schedule

Feb. 21-March 4 – Overland haul from Baker Lake with cat train bringing in fuel likely comprising one or two D6 cat(s) with several trailers to carry fuel (approximately 120 bbl). Fuel barrels will be dropped off at the Dore camp (50 bbl) as well as some at the ice landing strip (20 bbl – to be temporarily stored on shore near the ice strip) and the Hayes camp and Three Bluffs (50 bbl). Overland hauling will be operated and permitted by an expeditor from Baker Lake. Fuel storage resulting from the overland mobilization will be permitted by Committee Bay Resources. The overland haul crew will open and reside at the Hayes camp in existing structures while building and maintaining the landing strip.

March 4-9 – Clearing of ice landing strip (at 66°37'56", 91°42'23" or 66°35', 91°22'30") by a D6 cat for the Hercules aircraft following all regulations laid out by the licenser and the aircraft operator. Twin Otter support (with skis or wheel-skis) will be used to deliver people to the camp from Baker Lake or Rankin Inlet including ice inspectors for the runway. The ice strip will be inspected by representatives from the aircraft company prior to the first Hercules landing. Also, a weatherman chosen by the aircraft company will also be on site. At this time a helicopter (likely a Hughes 500) will be mobilized to camp from either Rankin Inlet or Yellowknife for crew mobilization and for emergency use.

March 9-May 11 – Intermittent Hercules flights from Baker Lake, Rankin Inlet and Yellowknife to supply the camp with building materials (wood for shacks, generator, etc.), fuel (400-600 barrels combined of Jet A1 and P50) and 3 Connors drills (1- Boyles 25A; 2- custom lightweight drill rigs; a Bombadier). The Hercules flights should total 7 from Yellowknife return including about 6 shuttles from Baker Lake or Rankin Inlet to the ice strip. The Hercules will also bring in additional heavy equipment to handle the significant amount of materials arriving in the area including a wheeled loader (with bucket and pallet forks) and another

D6 cat if required. In total we anticipate needing two D6 cats and a loader. The D6 cats will keep the strip clear and ferry goods from the ice strip to the Hayes, Dore and Bullion camps as well as move and support the drills. The loader will be used to load/unload the planes and cat skids and will stay at the strip location at all times. The Bombadier will be used to support the drills and ferry the drill crews from Hayes camp to Three Bluffs because it has an enclosed cab. Fuel and other supplies from the Hercules will be mobilised to the Hayes and Dore camps from the strip location as soon as possible. A fuel and equipment cache will be kept at the ice strip location (on shore) to fuel the cat and loader which will also remain at the strip, and until all the equipment can be mobilized to the appropriate camp location. One cat (if it originated from Yellowknife) and the loader will likely be flown back to Yellowknife on one of the last Hercules flights into the area. This will ensure that an excess of heavy machinery is not stored on the land for more time than necessary. Occasional Twin Otter flights may also be used at this time for supplying food and other supplies from local communities as well as moving people in and out of the Hayes and Dore camps. These flights will occur every 1 to 2 weeks.

March 12-31 – Camp construction including Hayes camp expansion and creation of the Dore Camp with the help of Discovery Mining Services. Supported by cat to supply building materials and fuel to the sites.

March 20-May 20 – Initial phase of drilling including 1 week each for drill mobilization and demobilization. Two drills will operate on the Three Bluffs occurrence from March 28-April 28 at which time the second drill will be mobilized to the Four Hills occurrence. While both drills are at Three Bluffs, the Hayes camp population will be about 25 people then about 15 when only one drill is operating at Three Bluffs. The Dore camp will be utilized by the crew drilling at Four Hills; it will not exceed 10 people during this time. Upon completion of the initial drill program the drills will be partially disassembled for storage on the Three Bluffs and Four Hills occurrences.

April 1-15 – Two weeks allowed for airborne geophysics over prospective areas to help in defining additional drill targets for the summer program. An extra helicopter will be mobilized from Rankin Inlet or Yellowknife for this and will be based out of the Hayes camp. The geophysical crew and extra helicopter pilot (3-5 people) will bring the Hayes camp population to about 30 people.

May 16-20 – Demobilization and shutdown of camps to allow for spring break-up. The Dore Camp will be deconstructed and packed up ready for mobilization to the new Bullion Camp site. No equipment will be left at the Dore campsite.

May 20-June 20 – Spring break-up, all people will be removed from the camps until the summer program. A full month is allowed for this break in the case that poor weather hinders the spring program and we have to run past May 16 to finish.

June 21-25 – Mobilization back into the Hayes camp for the summer program. The Dore camp equipment will be moved (if not already done so) to the Bullion Camp site and any camp construction and twin airstrip maintenance at the Bullion camp will be completed. This camp will be used predominately for geological fieldwork including mapping, sampling, prospecting and claim staking and potentially as a drill camp for high priority targets in the southwest end of the belt. Its population will not exceed 15 people.

June 21-Aug 4 – Second phase of drilling including 1 week each for mobilization and demobilization. One drill will operate at each of the Three Bluffs and Four Hills occurrences until about mid-July. The crews will occupy the Hayes camp for Three Bluffs drilling and Bullion for the Four Hills drilling. At about mid-July the drills will be mobilized to other occurrences in the Committee Bay belt that have been brought to the drill ready stage. Which camp(s) used for this stage of the drill program will be dependent upon the location of the occurrence being drilled.

July 1-Aug 30 – Geological fieldwork consisting of 6-8 people conducting mapping, prospecting and sampling. This will further our knowledge of the area and potentially bring more occurrences to the drill ready stage. Fieldwork will be conducted out of the Hayes and Bullion camps and potentially from the Crater camp for a few weeks. During this summer period logistical support (food, fuel, supplies, etc.) will be based on Twin Otter flights out of Yellowknife, Baker lake and Rankin Inlet (about 1 per week). At the Hayes camp an esker landing strip has been extensively used over the years in addition to the possibility of landing float-equipped planes on the neighbouring lake. The Bullion camp will be constructed on an esker that is suitable for tundra-tire equipped Twin Otter aircraft.

Aug 26-31 – Camp demobilization, complete shutdown for the winter.
