## ARCHAEOLOGY AND PALAEONTOLOGY PLAN

North Country Gold operates in compliance with the Terms and Conditions of the Government of Nunavut Archaeological and Palaeontological Resources, see attached.

A review of the Archaeological Survey, Ottawa on NTS 56 J, K, O and P identified six known archaeological sites. These sites were identified internally, none are near areas where there is planned exploration or interest. These sites will be avoided, respected and protected by North Country Gold. The Nunavut Atlas also identifies fishing and camping sites along the Hayes River and in the Walker Lakes, the Laughland Lake, Lake 975 area and the Ellice Hills area.

All personnel undergo a site orientation when they arrive at the project. During the orientation the rules, policies and procedures are thoroughly explained including the importance of protecting archaeological and or palaeontological sites.

If an archaeological site or a palaeontological site or fossil is encountered, the Department of Culture, Language, Elders and Youth (CLEY) will be contacted immediately. A report will be prepared documenting the discovery and filed with the Government of Nunavut (CLEY), the Inuit Heritage Trust and the Regional Inuit Association.
