**RE: Amendment to Water Licence 2BE-CRA1520**

Dear Ms Beaulieu,

North Country Gold Corp. (NCGC) would like to request the amendment of Water Licence 2BE-CRA1520 for the Committee Bay Project (CBP), located in the eastern Kitikmeot region of Nunavut Territory.

There are no proposed changes in the scope of the project. During 2016 and 2017 NCGC is proposing to complete a systematic exploration program across the Committee Bay Greenstone Belt designed to identify new gold deposits. This work will comprise:

- Airborne geophysical surveys.
- Continued aerial drone photographic and topographic surveying.
- Regional Soil and Till sampling surveys.
- Prospecting and geological mapping (mapping and/or gridding on various scales, property wide).
- Use of up to 2 GT RAB drill rubber track mounted unit to systematically sample bedrock in a quick and cost effective manner over selected areas.
- Use of up to 12 fly camps (up to 2 concurrently) to facilitate geophysics, drilling, soil sampling and/or prospecting in remote locations.
- Ground IP Geophysical surveys
- Diamond core drilling
- All other previously permitted activities

Part C "Conditions applying to water use" of NCGC's water licence 2BE-CRA1520 presently authorizes:

- Water for domestic use (Hayes, Bullion, Ingot, Crater, and fly camps) up to 50 cubic metres per day
- Water for diamond drilling up to 245 cubic metres per day.

NCGC respectfully requests to amend this water licence and authorize the 245 cubic metres per day presently allocated to diamond drilling to be also permitted for use under the "Industrial purposes" category. Specifically, this water will be used for local flooding/maintenance of the permitted ice airstrip constructed on Sandspit Lake (Hayes Camp) and the winter trail between Hayes Camp and Three Bluffs.

The use of water for "Industrial purposes" would occur over a relatively short time period during winter/spring operations (March-May) prior to significant diamond drill programs. Combined water use for drilling/industrial purposes would not exceed 245 cubic metres per day. Total water use would remain at 295 cubic metres per day, as currently permitted.



NCGC also requests authorization to conduct diamond drilling at a number of other prospects in addition to the Three Bluffs deposit. These localities are shown on Map A, and listed in Appendix 1 (Site locations) of the NCGC Detailed Non-Technical Summary. Water will be sourced from proximal lakes and static ponds.

No changes to Waste Disposal conditions are requested.
