Please see below for our responses to CIRNA.

As part of our response I have attached the nine management plans that were listed in our renewal cover letter.

In regards to the potential to "generate drilling wastes" our interpretation is that CIRNAC is referring to drill cuttings which are essentially rock particles mixed with water. The management of cuttings is covered under our Corporate and social responsibility action plan sections 14.5, 14.6, 14.8 and 14.9. Drill cuttings are also covered as specific terms and conditions of our land use permit - namely Conditions 35, 54, 55.

All drill cuttings are contained within a natural low lying area as close to the drill collar as feasible. The use of low lying natural sumps for containment of cuttings prevents dispersion by both v and rain / snow melt thus preventing siltation of surface waters. We have updated section 15 Block 14 of the application form to include drill waste / cuttings and have attached the relevant part of the state of t of the application here to replace the originals.
