RE: Project Update

Dear Ms. Beaulieu,

North Country Gold Corp. ('NCGC') is pleased to inform the Nunavut Water Board ('NWB') that it has formed an exploration alliance with Auryn Resources Inc. ('Auryn') to jointly explore the Committee Bay Project ('CBP') located within the eastern Kitikmeot region of Nunavut Territory. The companies are planning to recommence exploration at the CBP during the spring and summer of 2015.

Further to NCGC's correspondence with the NWB on February 10, 2015, NCGC wishes to advise the NWB that it will complete the removal of hazardous wastes from the site to approved disposal facility as requested by the Water Resources Officer during the 2014 Water Licence Inspection.

NCGC intends to open Hayes Camp by the first week of April 2015 in order to construct an ice airstrip to facilitate inbound supply flights and backhaul of hazardous waste materials. Hazardous wastes will then be airlifted to Churchill, MB and then transferred to rail carriers for transport to Winnipeg, MB. Waste will be processed by Tervita Corporation.

NCGC expects that waste disposal certificates will be issued by the end of May, 2015. NCGC will keep the NWB informed during the backhaul and waste disposal process. We regret that this could not be completed by the March 15 deadline imposed by the 2014 Water Licence Inspection Report due to both corporate and logistical delays inherent in the completion of NCGC's transaction with Auryn.

We trust that this will satisfy our obligation. Please do not hesitate to contact me if you have any questions or concerns.
