Re: Notice of Part 4 Screening for Golden Bull Resources Corp.'s "Committee Bay Greenstone Belt: Walker Lake" project proposal

Dear Bruce Goad:

On May 16, 2011 the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB or Board) received Golden Bull Resources Corporation's (GBR) "Committee Bay Greenstone Belt: Walker Lake" project proposal from Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development (AAND). The NIRB has assigned this project proposal file number **11EN030** – please reference this file number in all future related correspondence.

The project is located in the Kitikmeot Region, approximately 250 kilometres (km) northeast of the hamlet of Baker Lake and approximately 305 km southeast of the hamlet of Gjoa Haven. The program is proposed to take place annually through the summer months (June-September) each year from 2012 to 2016. The proposed exploration program involves the assessment of 22 mineral claims located solely upon Crown land, with exploration activities focussing upon gold and base metals.

The project activities include:

- Exploration program to consist of prospecting, geologic mapping, geophysical exploration, diamond drilling, and environmental baseline work including:
 - Airborne magnetic/EM and ground geophysical surveying;
 - Exploration drilling to a maximum hole depth of approximately 300 metres, to an initial total of 2000 to 3000 metres of on-land diamond drilling;
 - Limited exploration stripping, trenching or overburden removal, possible blasting;
- Establishment of a temporary base camp to accommodate a maximum of 25 persons including:
 - 7-10 canvas sleeping tents with wooden flooring and walls;
 - One each of first-aid, kitchen, cook's quarters, dry, storage, office, and core shack tents;

- Portable generator to provide electricity;
- Incinerator;
- Grey water sump;
- Garbage pit (for burial of incinerated garbage/sewage);
- Helicopter pad;
- Fuel containment berm/fuel storage site;
- Production of human, combustible, and non-combustible wastes;
- Use of water, production of grey water and waste water;
- On-site incineration of combustible solid wastes, sewage, and waste oil;
- Movement of personnel and drills supported by helicopter;
- Camp supply supported by twin otter aircraft (using skis, floats, or tundra tires, dependent upon seasonal conditions);
- Transportation, storage and use of chemical and hazardous materials;
- Transportation, camp and cache storage, and ongoing use of fuels including:
 - 41,000 Litres diesel;
 - 205 Litres gasoline;
 - 47,150 Litres aviation fuel;
 - 700 pounds propane; and,
- *Potential* transportation and storage of explosives for blasting.

- Whether the project proposal is likely to arouse significant public concern; and if so, why;
- Whether the project proposal is likely to cause significant adverse eco-systemic and socio-economic effects; and if so, why;
- Whether the project is of a type where the potential adverse effects are highly predictable and mitigable with known technology, (please provide any recommended mitigation measures); and
- Any matter of importance to the Party related to the project proposal.
