Please find below responses to your email enquiry regarding Indicator Minerals Inc, Water license application supplemental questionnaire for the Darby project. (NWB2DBY). The questions below relate to the initial Darby water license application supplemental questionnaire submitted.

Question 10

In addition to the company policy stated in Appendix C – sec8, pg10, initial camp locations are selected from NTS topo maps for land / water aircraft access. Additional information will be sought during community consultations planned for July 2005 with local northern and support groups to determine an appropriate site.

Question 30

Once samples have been analysed with an approved laboratory against the "Guidelines for Canadian Drinking Water Quality" chlorine will be used if the water quality analyses indicates that disinfection is required. The chlorine residual of the treated water will be within the range 0.14 - 1.14 mg/L.

Question 34

No authorization has been requested yet from the local hamlet.. Non combustible household waste will be removed from the Darby camp site during service flights from the Committee Bay Hayes camp. The refuse will then be further removed from the Hayes camp on a service flight back to the community of origin and appropriately disposed of in a designated land fill site.

Question 35

The camp footprint will ensure the sleep tents are arranged no closer than 50m from the waters edge with the remainder of the camp (kitchen/dry) arranged 100m from the waters edge with the sump located between the two main shelters.
