**Re: 2BE-DBY1014 – Spill Contingency Plan – Darby Project – Indicator Minerals Inc.**

### **Background**

The Darby Project is located in the Kitikmeot Region of Nunavut 200km southwest of Kugaaruk and 200km southeast of Gjoa Haven. The Stellar Camp located at the Darby Project is base camp for all activities within the Darby Project area. The site can accommodate a maximum of 35 people.

### **Recommendations/Comments**

INAC recommends that the Spill Plan should be revised to include the contact information for Peter Kusugak, INAC Field Operations Manager. He is the primary INAC contact for emergency purposes and can be reached by telephone at 867 975-4295 or fax at 867 979-6445.

INAC also recommends including the use of such items as drip pans, trays or absorbent pads as a preventative measure in avoiding minor spills during refuelling of minor equipment or associated activities.

Indicator Minerals Inc. is required to provide the Nunavut Water Board all outstanding information referred to above in order to comply with the amendment application for water license 2BE-DBY1014.
