# RE: Eqe Bay Exploration Program (2BE-EQE) – Request for a Type 'B' Water Licence

#### 1 - INTRODUCTION

Baffinland Iron Mines Corporation (Baffinland) is pleased to submit this request for a Type 'B' Water Licence for its proposed Eqe Bay Exploration Program. The location of the Eqe Bay Exploration Program is shown on Figures 1 and 2. The application and supporting materials are presented as Attachments 1 to 16.

#### 2 - BACKGROUND

Baffinland has been conducting surface exploration and mapping at Eqe Bay since 2013. To support further exploration, it will be necessary to establish an exploration camp at the Eqe Bay Exploration Area. An initial camp will be mobilized near the end of the 2019 sealift season and constructed during the fall of 2019. Exploration drilling will begin in early 2020. An initial camp and drilling program is proposed, though plans have been developed for an expanded camp after the first or second year of drilling. The expanded camp and exploration program is expected to consist of the following:


J	100-person camp equipped with a water treatment system, sewage treatment plant and incinerator
J	Airstrip
J	Barge ramp
J	Quarries
J	4-5 km access road between the camp and exploration area
J	Operation of up to 9 exploration drills


The maximum daily water use is expected to be 299 m<sup>3</sup>/day.


The proposed layout of the Eqe Bay Exploration Area is presented in Figure 3. The Project Proposal is further described in the attached documents.

#### 3 - NUNAVUT PLANNING COMMISSION CONFORMITY REVIEW

The Project has been processed by the Nunavut Planning Commission (NPC) under NPC File No. 148801. The NPC confirmed to Baffinland in an April 17, 2018 letter that the Eqe Bay Exploration Program is located within a planning region without an approved land use plan, and that the Project Proposal required screening by the Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB).







#### 4 - NUNAVUT IMPACT REVIEW BOARD SCREENING

The Nunavut Impact Review Board (NIRB) issued a Screening Decision Report (NIRB File No. 18EN026) on August 17, 2018 and recommended to the Minister of Intergovernmental Affairs, Northern Affairs and Internal Trade that the Eqe Bay Exploration Program be able to proceed without a review. The NIRB letter to the Minister and the Screening Decision Report are included with the attached regulatory correspondence (Attachment 3).

## **5 – AUTHORIZED REPRESENTATIVE**

This letter also authorizes our consultant, Knight Piésold Ltd., to be an authorized representative for Baffinland in the licensing process. The contact at Knight Piésold is Richard Cook, and his contact details are provided in Section 2 of the Water Licence Application Form (Attachment 2).
