## SUBJECT Water Licence No. 2BE-FBP1116, Roche Bay PLC – West Melville Iron Ore Project – Amendment Application – Qikiqtani Region

## A. PROJECT DESCRIPTION

**FROM** 

On May 4, 2012 the Nunavut Water Board (NWB or Board) distributed the above-referenced water licence amendment application to interested parties for review. APEX Geoscience Ltd., on behalf of Roche Bay PLC, are requesting that this licence be amended to allow for the construction of an exploration camp following the mobilization of personnel onto the project area during the 2012 field season. It was determined that the originally planned camp location would not meet Roche Bay PLC's. As a result, 3 potential camp locations have been identified based on available GIS data, satellite imagery, and correspondence with other exploration companies and government bodies.

APEX Geoscience Ltd. have not requested any changes to the licensed daily water consumption limit or waste management practices. A daily maximum of 25 m<sup>3</sup> of water will be consumed for camp purposes and 105 m<sup>3</sup> of water will be used to support drilling operations.

## **B. RESULTS OF REVIEW**

On behalf of Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada (AANDC), the following comments/ recommendations are submitted for the Board's consideration,

1. Broad Location Reference for Planned Exploration Camp

Aboriginal Affairs and Northern Development Canada has no issue with the proposal put forward by APEX Geoscience Ltd. to amend the project's water licence to allow for their exploration camp to be

established at a suitable location following the mobilization of project personnel in the 2012 field season. Following the selection of this location, Roche Bay PLC should notify the Board of the camp's coordinates and domestic water source. A licence amendment should be considered to ensure that this information is properly documented. If a licence amendment is processed.

2. AANDC Contact Identified in the Submitted Abandonment and Reclamation Plan

Section 8 of this project's Abandonment and Reclamation Plan should be revised to identify AANDC's Manager of Field Operations as the Department's emergency contact. The Manger of Field Operations can be contacted by telephone at (867) 975-4295 or fax at (867) 979-6445.
