SITE ACTIVITY REPORT - SPRING 2010

This letter is to provide you with an account of the site activities since our arrival to site on June 27th, 2010. Starfield personnel left site on July 8th, 2010 and will be returning to site mid-August.

Contaminated Soil

The drums in the secondary containment structure, where water had topped over along one side causing staining on the gravel, were removed and sorted. The drums were taken to the berm and stacked with the other drums according to fuel type. The water within the secondary containment structure was transferred to the berm. Further cleanup of this structure and the gravel around it will occur when Starfield personnel return to site mid August.

Garbage

Garbage and debris was collected from the tundra and a general site cleanup was undertaken. When we arrived at site there was still snow in areas. Personnel are encouraged to take garbage bags with them whenever they are working and as they walk from one area to the next any garbage lying around is picked up. Cleanup is ongoing and will continue in mid August when camp re-opens.
